Personally identifiable information may be disclosed to either parent of a dependent student regardless of which parent claims the student as a dependent, unless the school is aware of a court order that dictates otherwise. The school has the option of setting its own policy to control more tightly the disclosure of personally identifiable information to parents under certain circumstances.
