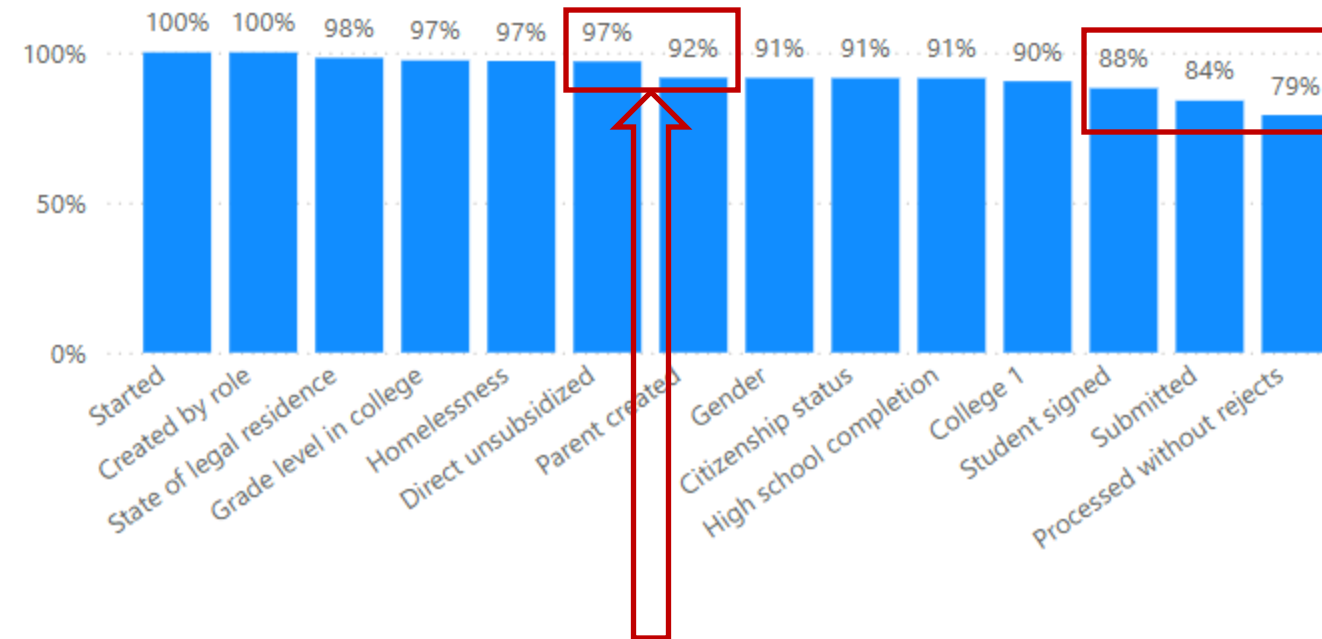

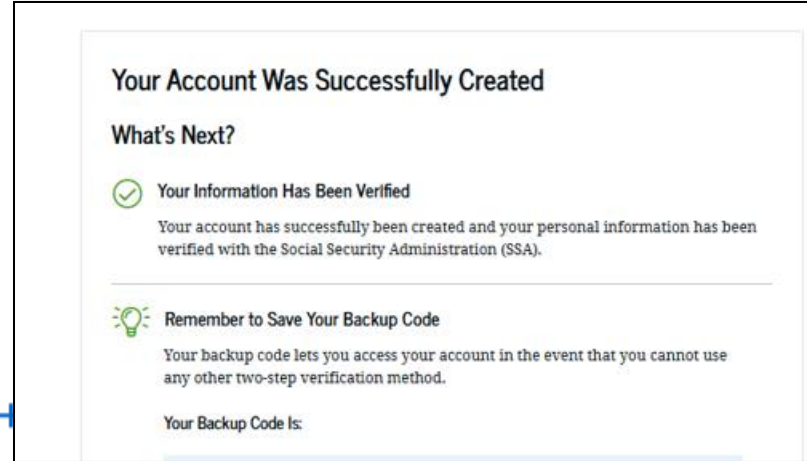

2026-27 FAFSA BETA TESTING



FSA will conduct beta testing of the 2026-27 FAFSA launch in advance of releasing to the public by Oct. 1, 2025.

- Testing online and paper FAFSA submissions with students and families
- Validating that their ISIRs are successfully delivered and data is accurate
- Addressing user feedback and fixing critical issues along the way

Goals:

- Launch by October 1 with no critical blockers or user issues
- Continue to engage real students, families, and partners to inform our roadmap

2026-27 FAFSA BETA KEY MILESTONES

- **August 4th: Beta 1 Opens**

- Events with a limited set of community-based organizations, districts, institutions
- Validate ISIR delivery with local IHEs and vendors

- **September 1st: Beta 2 Opens**

- Anyone can request access to the 2026-27 Beta FAFSA form on StudentAid.gov
- Continued testing with institutions and vendors

- **By October 1: General Release**

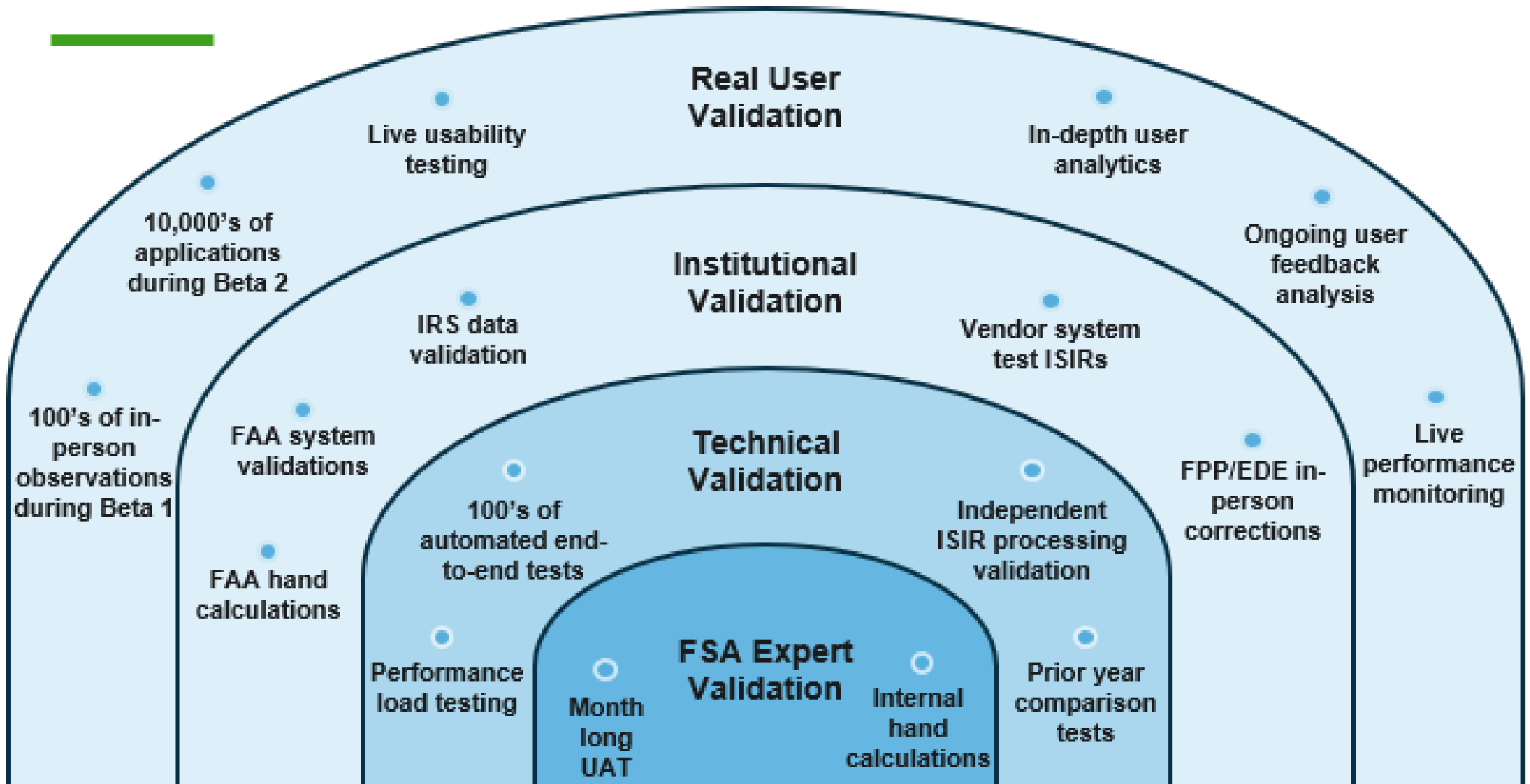

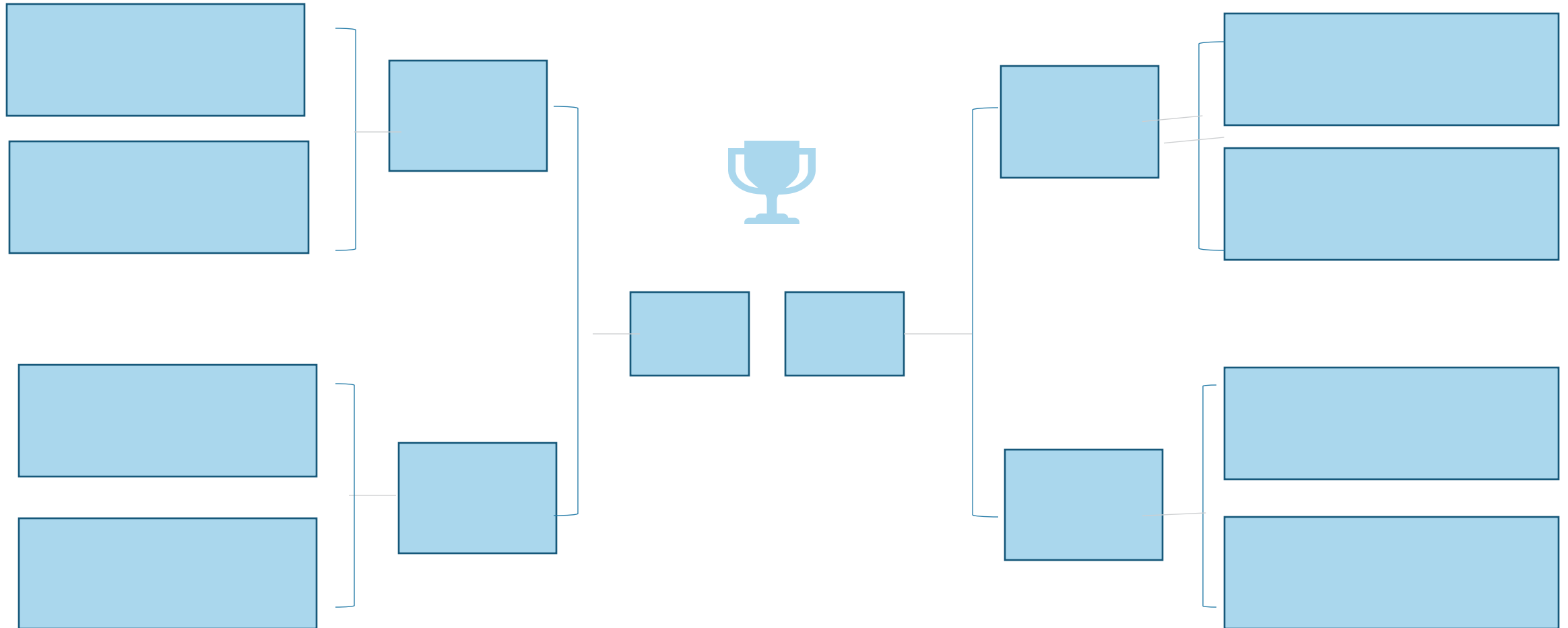

PRODUCT PRIORITIZATION-> FAFSA BRACKET



- **Receive ISIRs in alternative, more modernized format (e.g., JSON or XML)**
 - Currently, ISIR data is delivered via a flat file or fixed-length batch file. Receiving it in a more modernized format could provide your IT team and software vendor more flexibility, and increase efficiency.
- **Real-time ISIR processing and delivery**
 - Currently, ISIRs are processed in batch jobs within 1-3 days of initial submission or correction. Real-time processing would allow you to receive individual transactions immediately, as soon as they are initially submitted or a correction is made.

CROWD FAVORITES (WE HEARD YOU BEFORE!)

- **Provide an option to compare transactions in FPP**
 - Currently, when a new ISIR record is generated, it is not always clear what fields have changed from the prior transaction. This feature would allow you to compare multiple transactions for a particular student so you can easily see what changed.
- **Manage multiple award/cycle years within FPP at the same URL**
 - It can be difficult to toggle between different award years, or to determine what award year you are currently viewing/logged into. This feature would allow you to toggle between award years within the same link.
- **Make it easier to manage multiple school codes within FPP**
 - This feature would allow you to set a default code, and/or make it more obvious which code you are working with. That way an institution with multiple schools could more easily manage across codes.

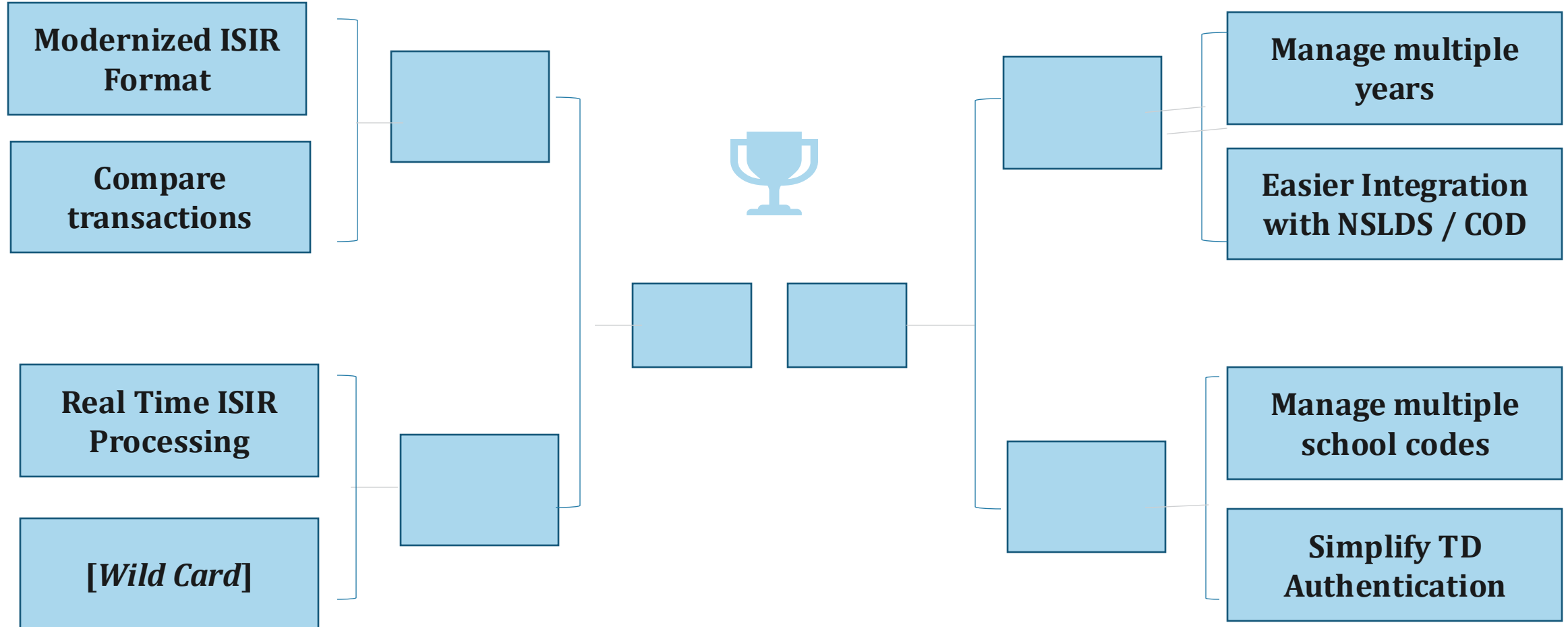
- **Provide easier access to or integration with NSLDS and/or COD websites in FPP**
 - This feature would allow you to click a link in FPP to instantly open a student's record in NSLDS and/or COD. Future integrations might integrate data from those sites directly into FPP to make it easier for FAAs to access that information.
- **Simplify TDClient authentication**
 - Currently, logging into TDClient is complex and requires technical knowledge. This improvement would simplify the authentication process.

Recent policy guidance

Expanded Late Disbursement Flexibilities – [GEN-25-25](#)

- In EA-GENERAL-25-25 (published May 27, 2025) we extended the late disbursement flexibilities that were previously limited to applicants who applied via the paper (PDF) FAFSA form, to all applicants who applied during the 2024-25 application cycle, regardless of method (online or paper).
- Flexibilities are extended to students who are impacted by a known issue that prevented their official SAI from being calculated by the FAFSA Processing System (FPS) prior to the end of their enrollment.
- Check the Known Issues Guide in the FAFSA Simplification Section of the Knowledge Center
- Use the additional flexibilities to award financial aid and make late disbursements to students whose applications were impacted by known issues and who would have otherwise been eligible to receive Title IV funds prior to the end of their enrollment during the 2024-25 cycle.

Open Issues

Last updated: 05/12/2025

ISIRs delivered with blank SAIs and no reject code. (Updated 5/12/25)

Status: Open (Reopened on 4/10/2025)

Description: Due to missing data from the Federal Tax Information Module (FTIM), schools were receiving a small number of ISIRs with no SAI and no rejected code. In some instances, the Department discovered that the blank SAI was caused by a missing family size value, which required a student correction to resolve.

Resolution: Starting the week of Feb. 24, 2025, the Department temporarily assigned Reject Code 68 and Comment Code 329 to these impacted records. Schools should have then received new system-generated ISIRs with the FPS Correction Reason code set to “A,” reflecting the FTIM Result Update. In these cases, the records no longer have the Reject Code 68

2025–2026 Award Year: FAFSA Information to be Verified and Acceptable Documentation - [2025–2026 Award Year: FAFSA Information to be Verified and Acceptable Documentation | Knowledge Center](#)

- Amended [APP-25-16](#) expanding identity verification (V4) for first time students attending the summer semester
- Currently limited to summer pending updated FSA fraud prevention
- Updates to acceptable documentation for identity verification
 - Present ID in person or on video
 - Use a 3rd party vendor that meet NIIST standards
 - No more Statement of Educational Purpose

2025–2026 Award Year: FAFSA Information to be Verified and Acceptable Documentation - [2025–2026 Award Year: FAFSA Information to be Verified and Acceptable Documentation | Knowledge Center](#)

- In the past we have requested individuals who are victims of IRS tax-related identity theft to obtain a Tax Return DataBase View (TRDBV) transcript from the IRS for verification purposes.
 - Due to the long processing time, individuals who are victims of IRS tax-related identity theft can provide a copy of their signed 2023 income tax return and applicable schedules and must also provide an IRS 4674C letter (a letter from the IRS acknowledging the identity theft) or a statement signed and dated by the tax filer indicating that he or she was a victim of IRS tax-related identity theft, and the IRS is aware.

2025–2026 Award Year: FAFSA Information to be Verified and Acceptable Documentation - [2025–2026 Award Year: FAFSA Information to be Verified and Acceptable Documentation | Knowledge Center](#)

- A confined or incarcerated student is only required to verify their identity and sign the statement of educational purpose. Institutions are not required to verify a confined or incarcerated student selected under Verification Tracking Group V1.
 - Acceptable documentation of identity includes official IDs issued by the correctional facility. In addition,
 - If a confined or incarcerated student is unable to submit a signed and notarized Statement of Educational Purpose, a school may accept a signed statement from an authorized official who works for the correctional facility or the oversight entity confirming to the school that the individual who completed the FAFSA form and was selected for verification is the person signing the Statement of Educational Purpose.

Recent policy guidance

Students who have a pseudo-Social Security number (SSN) [2024-25 and 2025-26 FAFSA® Updates | Knowledge Center](#)

- FAFSA applicants from the Freely Associated States (the Republic of Palau, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, or the Federated States of Micronesia) who do not have an SSN are assigned a “pseudo-SSN”
- Returning applicants who have a pseudo-SSN should reuse their assigned pseudo-SSN when filing the FAFSA form in subsequent years (will automatically be associated with their FAFSA form when they log in with their StudentAid.gov account).
- Returning applicants who complete the paper FAFSA form are instructed to enter their previously assigned pseudo-SSN

Recent policy guidance

Students who have a pseudo-Social Security number (SSN) [2024-25 and 2025-26 FAFSA® Updates | Knowledge Center](#)

- In very few cases, some returning applicants who were previously assigned a pseudo SSN were incorrectly assigned a new pseudo-SSN by the system.
 - This created duplicate records and made it difficult for institutions to track lifetime eligibility used [LEU] and aggregate loan limits.
 - Common Origination and Disbursement (COD) sweeps accounts twice per week to match new pseudo-SSN customer records with existing records. Any institutions that continue to see students with multiple pseudo-SSNs should contact the [FSA Partner and School Relations Center](#) to have the records manually linked.

Recent policy guidance

FAFSA Submission Summary request functionality in FAFSA Partner Portal (FPP) for paper filers [2024-25 and 2025-26 FAFSA® Updates | Knowledge Center](#)

- On March 30, the Department implemented new functionality in the FPP to enable the reprinting of a FAFSA Submission Summary for applicants who applied using the paper FAFSA form (for both 2024-25- and 2025-26)
- Feature is not limited to, but especially necessary for incarcerated students
- FAAs can request the reprint of a FAFSA Submission Summary on behalf of the student, with the option to indicate it be mailed to either the student's address on the FAFSA form or to a new mailing address

Recent policy guidance

FAFSA Submission Summary request functionality in FAFSA Partner Portal (FPP) for paper filers [2024-25 and 2025-26 FAFSA® Updates | Knowledge Center](#)

- FAAs should coordinate with the student (and the student's correctional facility when applicable) to determine the best address to send the FAFSA Submission Summary reprint.
- If the student elects to have the reprint sent to an address other than what is on the FAFSA, the address provided for the reprint will not overwrite the address on the FAFSA record.
- FAAs can access this new feature in FPP by searching for a specific student, selecting the applicable transaction, and clicking the "FAFSA Submission Summary Reprint" button that displays underneath the Transaction Details section.

Recent policy guidance

Institutional Student Information Record (ISIR) request functionality. [2024-25 and 2025-26 FAFSA® Updates | Knowledge Center](#)

- On March 30, the Department restored the ability for institutions and states to request a single ISIR or a specified group of ISIRs from the FAFSA Processing System.
- The feature can be accessed on the FAFSA Partner Portal
- Requests may be submitted by the Destination Point Administrator enrolled for FAFSA batch services for your organization, or by FAFSA Online Services users enrolled for ISIR requests.
- To avoid delays state agencies and institutions should consider limiting ISIR requests to a one-month time range.

Unaccompanied Homeless Youth

Unaccompanied Homeless Youth Determinations

- The student self-reports their status by indicating they have a determination from one of the authorized entities:
 - McKinney-Vento; The director (or designee) of an emergency or transitional shelter, street outreach program, homeless youth drop-in center, or other program serving individuals who are experiencing homelessness; The director (or designee) of a Federal TRIO program or a Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate program (GEAR UP) grant; an FAA at another institution who documented the student's circumstance in the same or a prior award year.
- In the absence of a determination by the entities above, an applicant who has indicated that they are an unaccompanied homeless youth will *follow the same FAFSA flow* as a Provisionally Independent student; but
- Unaccompanied homeless youth determinations are separate from professional judgments made under the unusual circumstances provision

Second Chance Pell and Prison Education Programs

Incarcerated Students

- Monthly and Annual Reporting Requirements
- Second Chance Pell (SCP) to Prison Education Program Transitions (Revised SCP ends on June 30, 2026)
- PEP Milestone 3: The institution must submit the PEPs to the Department for approval by January 1, 2026, and must have PEP programs approved before July 1, 2026, to continue offering Pell Grants to enrolled students
- [GENERAL-24-118](#) Revised Instructions for Applying for Prison Education Programs

Reminders:

- The title of the program must include “Prison Education Program.” For example, if the program is “Business Administration,” you would enter “Business Administration - Prison Education Program”
- Ensure all signature are included
- Ensure all required “best interest determination” elements are included
- Clearly identify transfer and release data components

Quick Updates

- Look out for changes to FISAP for 26-27 funding with the new 24-25 SAI and Pell eligibility formulas
 - Max Pell vs Auto Zero;
 - ISIR intermediate values and FISAP Total Income
 - Keep in mind FISAP Total Income is FTI

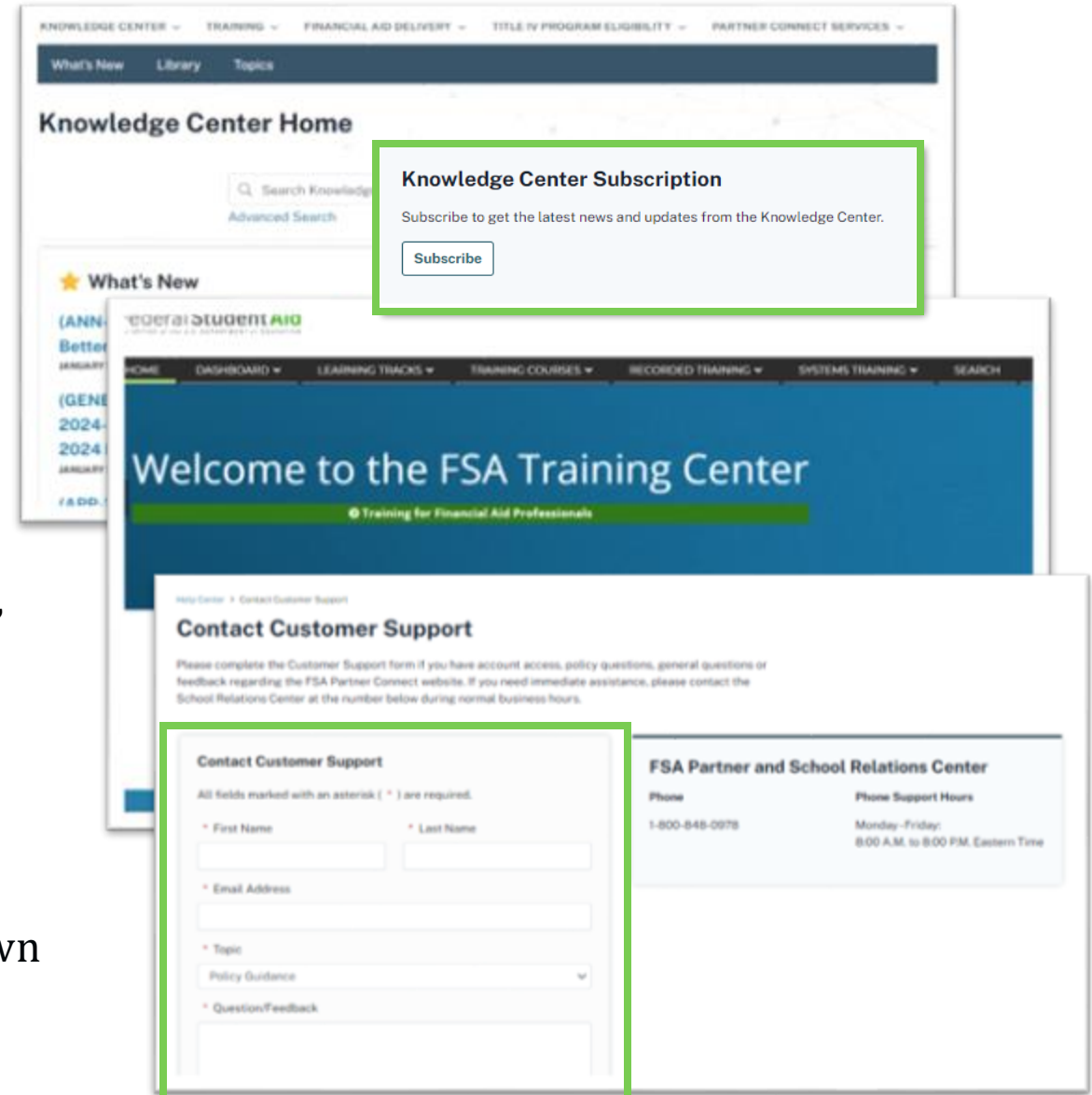
