- Unified government for the first time since 2010
- NASFAA has outlined priorities for new Congress and Administration

 - "Repeal and Replace" Obamacare
 - -Tax Cuts
- Repealing Obama-era Regulations
 - -Congressional Review Act
 - -Immediate repeal of executive orders
- Infrastructure Package?

Budget and Funding

- Continuing Resolution (CR) funds the federal government through Dec. 9.
 - Another CR will bridge the gap into the Spring, perhaps through April?
- Pell Grant Program surplus tempting for appropriators
- Unlikely to see year-round Pell return in this budget cycle (FY 2017), but still a bipartisan policy idea for HEA or FY 2018

- With ESEA taken care of in the last session of Congress, HEA is next in the queue.
- Rep. Foxx, among others, has made beginning work on HEA in 2017 a priority.
- Same committee leaders in place in Senate

Regulatory Outlook: Congress

Eligible for review under the Congressional Review Act (CRA) (Simple Majority to Overturn)

- Borrower Defense to Repayment
- Teacher Preparation Program
- State Authorization for Distance Education (Final rule not yet published)
- Department of Labor FLSA
 Overtime Rule (Depends on date
 of recess)

Not Eligible under CRA, but could be targeted (60 Votes in Senate to Overturn)

- Gainful Employment
- Credit Hour Definition
- Cash Management
- Department of Labor FLSA Overtime Rule (Depends on date of recess)

Regulatory Outlook: Dept. of Ed

- Still awaiting final State Authorization for Distance Education rule and technical additions to Borrower Defense rule.
 - Both can be repealed under CRA
- Trump Department of Education can repeal or revise older regulations, but it would technically require negotiated rulemaking


